What is an Online Facilitator Volunteer?

We are looking for volunteers who are passionate about improving the lives of unpaid carers to help us deliver a series of interactive, informative and fun online sessions.

By facilitating or delivering an online session, you'll be enabling carers to take a short break from their caring responsibilities to connect with others.

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What will you get out of it?

This is a highly rewarding opportunity to support carers. You'll hear directly from carers about how they've benefited from the sessions and have the chance to develop your facilitation and interpersonal communication skills along the way.

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What's involved?

You will facilitate or deliver one or more online sessions for unpaid carers. This involves:

- attending Spotlight On and Me Time sessions to understand how they work
- supporting Carers Wales staff to facilitate sessions, or perhaps hosting one yourself – welcoming attendees and introducing the guest speaker, monitoring the chat and troubleshooting.

You may also wish to deliver a session yourself related to your own expertise and areas of interest.

About our sessions

Spotlight on – a series of fun and relaxing sessions led by visiting speakers and practitioners, covering topics from meditation and craft to singing and Latin dance for beginners.

Me Time - a series of fun and relaxing sessions for carers in Wales, led by visiting speakers and practitioners.

The skills you'll need...



- excellent online communication and facilitation skills
- a friendly personality
- basic understanding of video conferencing platforms (eg Zoom)
- subject knowledge which would be of interest to carers (if delivering a session)
- an understanding of the issues carers face is desirable.



How we will support you

We'll give you all you need to get started. Your Volunteering Pack will include a handbook, and Zoom training. You'll also receive invites to our online meetups and be able to attend an online training/ briefing session before you facilitate or deliver your first session.

In addition, we'll send you monthly volunteer newsletters and invitations to our monthly online volunteer meetups.



How to apply


To apply, please complete our online application form. We will then be in touch to arrange an informal chat to discuss whether the role is right for you.
